

## Common Household & Garden Poisons

Chocolate; coffee grounds; xylitol; antifreeze\*; tobacco, cigarettes, cigars; snail, ant & rodent poisons, hops

### Cats

Acetaminophen (Tylenol) one tablet (325 mg) can be dangerous to a 7 pound cat.

Lilies of any kind and any part, including pollen can cause kidney failure and can be fatal.

### Dogs

Grapes, raisins, onions and hops can be fatal to dogs

### Potentially fatal plants

Azalea, Oleander, Mistletoe, Sago Palm, Easter Lily, Yew
